Introduction

- * This resource note describes a number of data products developed by Statistics Canada for the 1996, 2001 and 2006 Censuses
- * The data products can facilitate quick data access and comparison – a useful tool for the development of the Community Social Profile
- For example, one can easily analyze and compare sociodemographic variables for one or many municipalities (CSDs) over a period of 10 years (1996 to 2006)
- * A series of summary data trends (1996-2006) for 85 key data indicators is readily available

Introduction

- ***** Target municipalities can be ranked by selected variables
- * In most cases, the data can be downloaded to an Excel file
- * The current PCensus DBX only allows a five year comparison (2001 and 2006) and percentage values or rate of change have to be calculated
- PCensus DBX does not provide totals for CD (Census Division), one has to add all the component CSDs together

- You can compare the data with another geography by changing the "select another region" button, Ontario is shown as default

- * There is a mapping function to show the geography of the study area
